Honest and true!

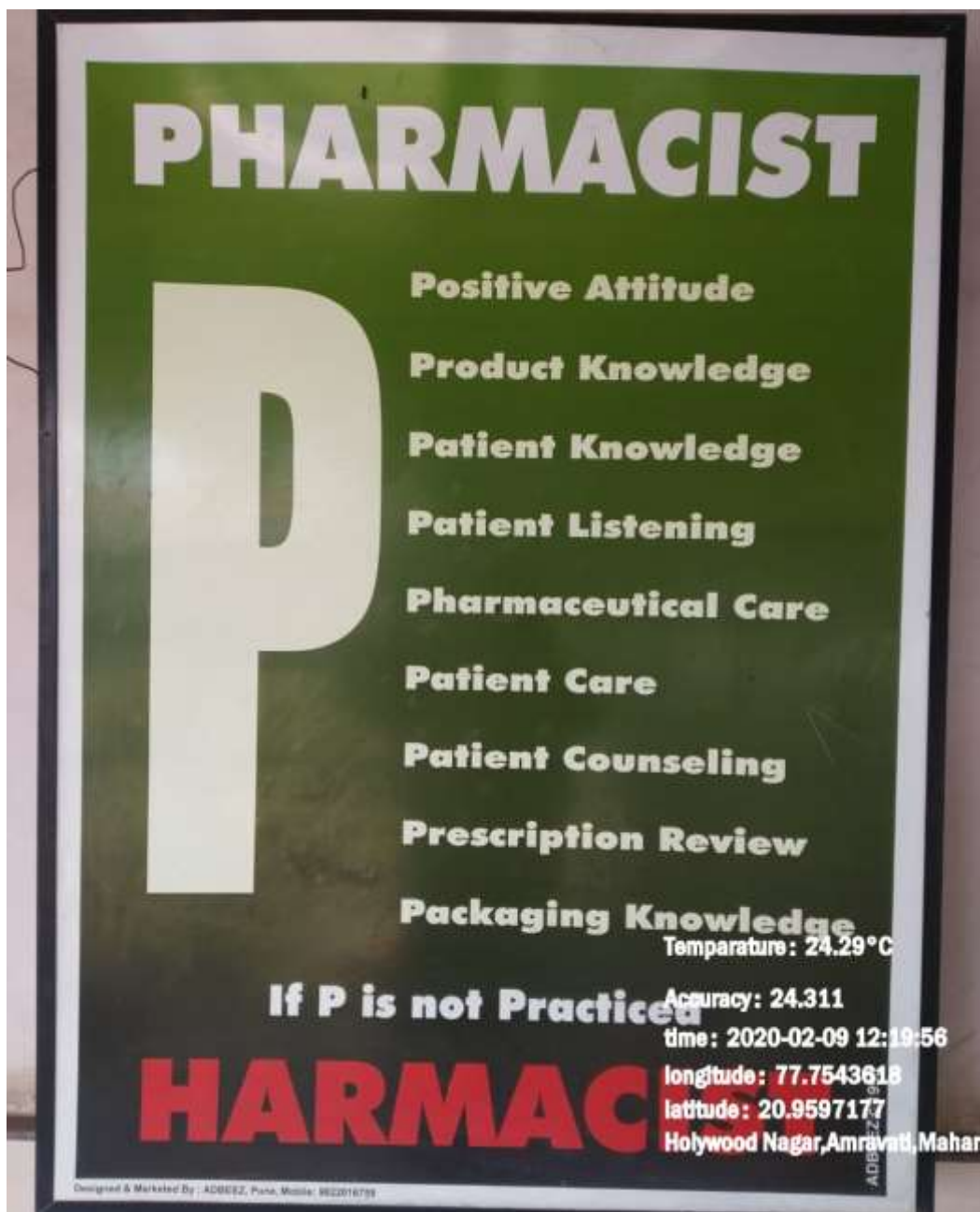

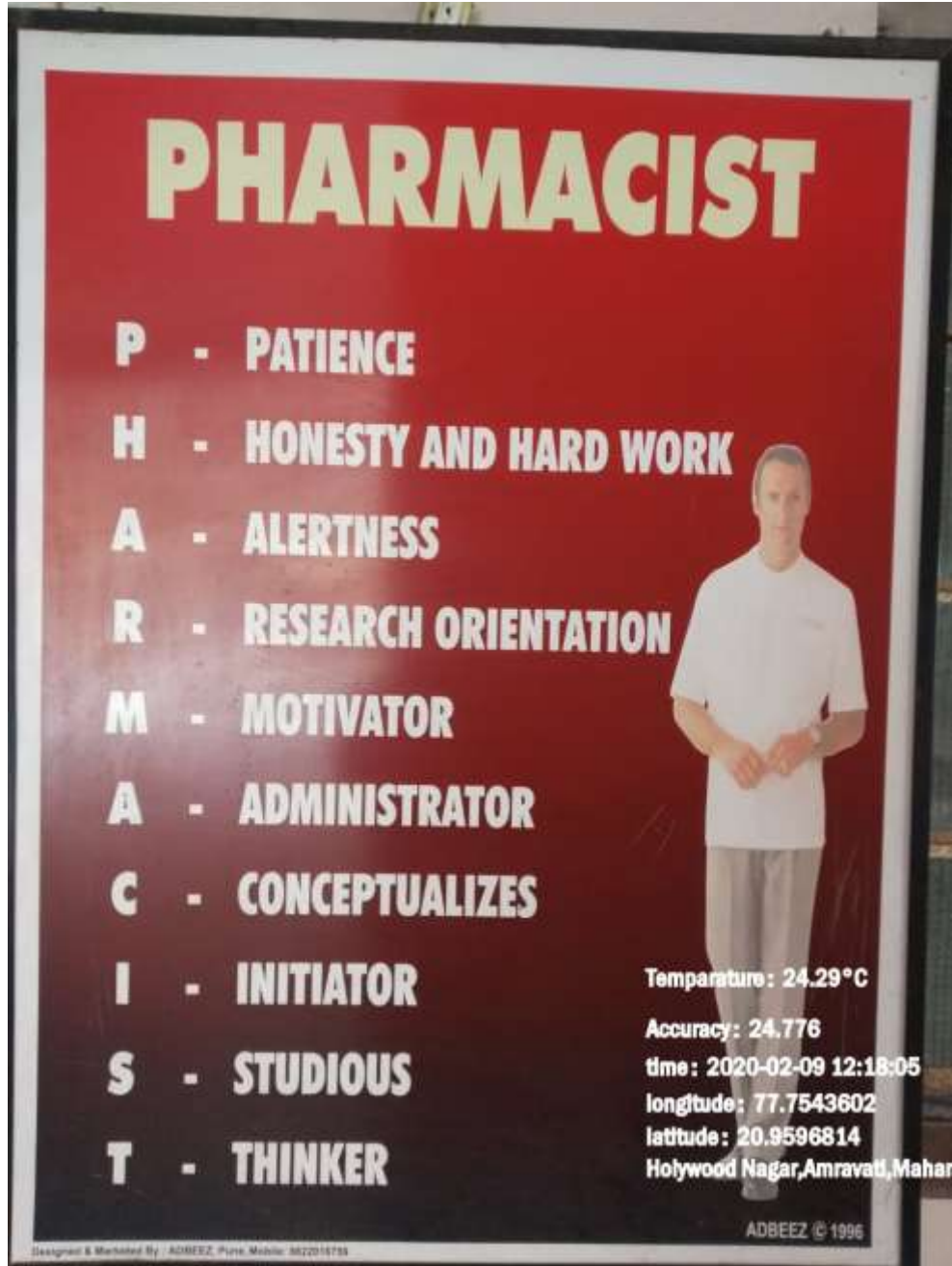

Pharmaceutical Care as the Model for Pharmacy Practice

Data Collection

1. Review patient medical record
2. Review medication profile
3. Interview patient

Develop or identify the CORE Pharmotherapy Plan

Identify drug-related problems of patient needs (PRAC)

Formulate a Pharmaceutical Care Plan

FOLLOW-UP

- Communicate Plan with Patient, Health care team, etc.
- Document action to take in patient medical record

Medication timing

1. Indication timing
2. Medication (s) without indication
3. Medication (s) without medication
4. Potential or actual drug-drug or drug-food interaction
5. Drug-drug, or food interaction
6. Optimal drug selection
7. Pharmacokinetics
8. Education
9. Potential cost saving (N to PD, etc.)

Plan Includes

- PROBLEMS
- ASSESSMENT
- RESOLUTION/RECOMMENDATION
- MONITORING

KEY POINTS

1. Focus on outcomes, not interventions
2. Only Pharmacy students are required; pharmacist can make rounds without medication
3. Use the approach with all clinical programs, not in pharmaceuticals; Being a clinical pharmacist roles, skills, attributes, etc.

Responsibility of a Pharmacist

1. Patient Counselling

When to take	How to take	How long to take	Proper storage	Side effects & Contraindications
Audiovisual & illustrations to be given		Mode of administration		

2. How to remove from the package

When the packing becomes all the more sophisticated, the pharmacist has to explain to the patient how to remove the medicine from the package

3. How to administer the medication

1. Place on tongue & swallow with water
2. Do not chew (Warning)
3. Chew & Swallow.
4. Soak the tablet.
5. Place under tongue & let it dissolve (sublingual)
6. Place between Gum & Cheek (buccal) & let it dissolve
7. Dissolve in water & swallow

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Working Relationship Between Physicians and Pharmacist in Medicinal Therapy

When Counseling Patient, the Pharmacist may focus on correct usage, treatment adherence, dosage, precautions and storage information.

The Pharmacist's Responsibilities

- 1) Ensuring safe procurement, adequate storage and dispensing of medicines.
- 2) Providing information to patients, which may include the name of medicine, its purpose, potential interactions and its side effects as well as correct usage and storage.
- 3) Reviewing prescription orders to identify interactions, allergic reactions, contra - indications and therapeutic duplications Concerns should be discussed with the prescriber.
- 4) At the request of the patient, discussing medicine related problems or concerns with regard to prescribed medicines.
- 5) Advising patients, when appropriate, on the selection and the use of non - prescription medicine and the patients management of minor symptoms or ailments (accepting the responsibility of such advice).
- 6) Where self Medication is not appropriate, advising patient to consult their physician for diagnosis and treatment.
- 7) Reporting adverse reactions to medicines
- 8) Providing and sharing general as well as specific information and advice with the public and health care providers.
- 9) Maintaining a high level Knowledge about medicines through continuing professional development.
